2021 WRANGLER Program

We have updated the 3 classifications of Wrangler Membership in CCMSA to improve cohesiveness with the CMSA USA Wrangler points tracking system and to still abide by our differing Canadian Firearms Laws. Our goal is to train and prepare our youth for full competition starting at age 18 in Canada and age 12 in the USA

The following applies to practices, competition and demonstrations

- ✓ Pylon cones will be placed to direct wranglers through courses.
- ✓ Pee wee, Novice and Junior Wranglers will be briefed and walked through patterns on their horses prior to being timed.
- ✓ Parent must designate a guardian if they are absent for each shoot. The Wrangler must carry a letter with them like a PAL
- ✓ The range master has the final say in all instances.
- ✓ No participant under 18 years of age shall fire ANY firearm while mounted at any practice, jackpot, clinic or competition
- ✓ Kid may move up when deemed ready by the parent – however the Range Master has final input w/r/t safety at all shoots.
- ✓ No move backs so Wranglers should practice, practice, practice!

Pee wee Wrangler- Any child under the age of 18 as of the day after CMSA World Championships

- requires being lead through the course and
- automatically will score 60 seconds per run as per CMSA Rules and
- will NOT participate shooting on the ground.

Novice Wrangler- Any child under the age of 18 as of the day after CMSA World Championships

- will ride thru the course with no assistance and
- engage targets as per the CMSA rulebook regarding Wranglers and
- will NOT participate shooting on the ground and
- have holsters and at least 1 cap gun is encouraged and
- scoring as per CMSA Wrangler rules

Junior Wrangler- Any child under the age of 18 as of the day after CMSA World Championships

- will be briefed on the course and will participate in course walk through patterns on horse prior to being timed
- qualifies by a demonstration of skill and
- is approved to shoot by the range master and
- will be wearing all proper attire for competition including hat, safety glasses, ear protection, chinks, holsters and
- will shoot all balloons from the ground, with-in arms distance and in direct supervision of a shooter with valid Restricted Pal
- penalties are the same as adult counterparts, as per decision by range master and
- scoring as per CMSA Wrangler rules and
- the competitor must hold a current CCMSA Family Membership
